The Busyness of our Main Office

- Recess & Lunch Recess is scheduled from 10:40-10:55am, 12:05-1:00pm and 2:10-2:25pm each day. If you need to pick up your child during these times, please ensure our office is aware before they head outside as your child will be a little easier to track down.
- End of the Day It is our expectation that our students stay with us until 3:45pm each day. If on the odd occasion you need to pick up your child before that time, we ask that you give our office a call before 3:00pm so that we can ensure the message will make it to their homeroom in time.

School Safety

Here are a few concerns that we would appreciate your cooperation with...

- Firstly, please be aware of our front pilons, along with posted signs designating areas of No Stopping/No Parking.
- If you are dropping your child off in the parking lot in front of our bus loop, please ensure your child crosses the bus lane at one of the two crossing areas (openings in the fence and marked with a bright yellow crosswalk sign). Crossing anywhere else in that zone becomes a safety concern.
- For our parents who drop off students in the back of our school, we ask that you avoid driving past the pilons into our old parking lot, as this area is now part of our playground.
- Lastly, if due to congestion you are dropping off your child on the west side of School Blvd. we ask that you assist them across the road.

Lunch Reminders

Here are a few lunch reminders that we would like to share with you.

- Students are invited to remain at school over the lunch hour. Students who choose to do so have the following expectations:
 - Lunches are eaten in the classroom (except for special privileges).
 - Students remain in their desks until the bell.
 - Student leave the classroom tidy and clean.
- Students are allowed off school grounds for lunch if...
 - Town students have a note at the beginning of the year saying they will be going home for lunch during that school year.
 - Students who do not regularly go home for lunch bring a note on the specific day.
 - Parents have made arrangements with the office.
