The Umbrella Project at Blumenort School

Do something you enjoy before problem solving. It's easy for children to obsess over the unpleasant things that happen to them. When we try to problem solve right after one of these events, it can be difficult to build optimism. Our brain naturally wants to match our memories and thoughts with the current mood we are in. Right after something unpleasant happens, it's much more likely that our brain will turn to pessimistic thoughts.

If you notice this happening with your child, help them learn to put something they enjoy in between the unpleasant event and problem solving, when possible. This strategy helps to bring them back to a more positive mood which will, in turn, lead to more optimistic problem solving. It will also improve the creativity of the solutions they come up with.

Just remember to come back to the problem after the enjoyable activity. This shouldn't end in problem avoidance. It should instead teach your child that they can build optimism and better problem solving skills by intentionally improving their mood before they tackle difficult challenges.

Notice of Approved Petitions for Blumenort School

Petition for Religious Exercises (2022-23)

Hanover School Division Board of Trustees has received a petition requesting that religious exercises be held at Blumenort School during the 2022-23 school year. The petitioners have specified their desire for the recitation of the Lord's Prayer and the reading of a Bible passage or story from the Bible. As the petition bears the signatures of parents/guardians representing more than 60 students in the school, the Board of Trustees has authorized religious exercises as specified above. These exercises are to be held before the official instructional day in a designated common area of the school.

Petition for Religious Instruction (2022-23)

Hanover School Division Board of Trustees has received a petition requesting that religious instruction be held at Blumenort School during the 2022-23 school year. The petitioners have specified their desire for the Discovery Time Program offered by Child Evangelism Fellowship. As the petition bears the signatures of parents/guardians representing more than 25 students in the school, the Board of Trustees has passed the required by-law permitting religious instruction as specified above. This instruction is to be offered by volunteers during designated half-hour per week classes.

Parents/Guardians who did not sign the submitted petitions are eligible to join at any time by delivering a signed note to the school office. The note must indicate the name and grade of the student for whom permission to participate is being given and include parent/guardian signature. The school principal will forward all received documentation to the HSD Administration Office. Only children whose parents/guardians signed the petition or have subsequently joined via permission note may participate in the exercises and instruction as described above.

Religious exercises and religious instruction in public schools may only be implemented by school boards in a manner consistent with the Public Schools Act and Provincial Guidelines, after petition by parents/guardians. Petitions must be presented to the board on an annual basis in advance of the next school year. Original petitions must be submitted to the Hanover School Division Administrative Office by April 30th.

Dear Hanover School Division Families,

We thank you and your family for being our valued partners as we work together to educate the children in our school division. As you may already be aware, building our social-emotional learning (SEL) skills is an important goal for each school. Between May 23 and June 20, our Grades 3-12 students will participate in an online survey to collect information on various topics at school. The survey that students will work with this year is the same survey HSD students completed last year. Our goal is to continue to provide an excellent education for your child, and we believe that compiling this information will be extremely helpful in our planning.

The Superintendents team has chosen to use the <u>Panorama Education</u> survey platform to gather feedback. Grades 3-5 students will complete a survey of 31 questions, whereas Grades 5-12 students will complete a total of 39 questions. Both surveys have questions from the following categories; school belonging, school climate, school engagement, school safety, grit, and school teacher-to-student relationships. Students will have the opportunity to ask their teacher any clarifying questions while taking the survey, and each survey should only take 15-20 minutes to complete. Students will access the survey link on our HSD website and complete the survey using an HSD Chromebook, iPad, or desktop computer.

We are asking that all eligible students participate. Their survey responses will provide invaluable insights into their learning experiences and how we can improve and adapt our school division to meet their learning needs. If students do not have enough information to answer a question or prefer not to answer, they can skip the item altogether. Your child's survey responses will be kept completely confidential.

If you have any questions about the SEL survey, please don't hesitate to contact your child's school. If you would like to review the survey, a copy will be made available at your child's school (front office). Due to copyright restrictions, we are unable to distribute the survey via email.
