<u> Umbrella Project - Dr. Jen</u>

Help kids see what they have in common with others. Having high empathy is linked with increased happiness and scholastic achievement. To build this important skill, help kids see what they have in common with others. One of the biggest predictors of prejudices and a failure to empathize with members of other groups, is having little or no contact with people who aren't like you. Research shows that schools can boost empathy by fostering an inclusive, warm attitude towards cultural diversity and you can do this at home too. Take stock of how often your kids play with others who are different from them. Do your girls play with boys and vice versa? What about other cultures? What about the adults around them? How wide is your child's perspective? Encourage diversity to learn about and empathize with others. Until next time, Dr. Jen, The Umbrella Project
