Planning Priority #3

- Our Grade 1-8 students will engage in grade-level and classroom-based problem-solving assessments that will drive instruction.
- Our Numeracy Support Teachers will meet with each homeroom teacher to discuss the results, trends, and next steps.
- As a staff, we will engage in Problem Solving PD, based around the work of David Costello.
- Grades 4-8 teachers will continue their professional learning in NAP (Numeracy Achievement Project).
